

Интеллектуальная игра «Битва Эрудитов»

Цель: повышение интереса к изучению иностранного языка

Задачи:

- развитие познавательного интереса к различным разделам науки через изучение английского языка;
- расширение кругозора;

- развитие коммуникативной компетенции;
- развитие памяти;
- повышение положительной мотивации к изучению английского языка;

- воспитание духа соперничества, группового взаимодействия и взаимоуважения в ходе игры

Форма работы: групповая

Участники: 2 – 4 команды

Длительность мероприятия – 40 минут

Оборудование:

- презентация «Battle of Erudite»;

Игра рассчитана на учащихся 9 -11 классов, обладающих достаточным багажом знаний в различных предметных науках.

Предварительная подготовка: создаются команды по 6 человек, выбирается капитан, и готовятся название каждой команде.
